SÈTE BEACHES

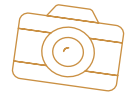
Start your day with a good dose of sea air! Over 12km of sandy beaches are yours for the taking on a sun-drenched seaside stroll. Cyclists can ride to Marseillan on the greenway that runs along the coast or even cycle around Thau Lagoon (approx. 60km).

A trip to Halles de Sète market hall will get your mouth watering! The market is jam-packed with the best local produce and specialities (fish, shellfish, tielle seafood pies etc.) for you to sample inside or out on the terrace. The market hall is open every morning.

CULTURAL TIME-OUT

Sun-drenched and magnetic Sète is a cultural town by nature and its energy bursts from the events hosted by its many museums and art galleries. Experience an amazing array of exhibitions at the likes of Musée Paul Valéry, Centre Régional d'Art Contemporain, Musée International des Arts Modestes and Espace Georges-Brassens. You're bound to be inspired by Sète. Pick up a pass for discounted entry to five cultural sites.

CANALSIDE WALK

Climb to the top of Mont Saint-Clair and reconnect with nature in Les Pierres Blanches forest. Soak up panoramic views of the Mediterranean, Thau Lagoon, shellfish farms and lido. On clear days you can even see the Pyrenees.

Dinner

IN THE OLD PORT

Countless restaurants await on the docks or old port. They're the place to sample seafood and scrumptious local specialities such as "macaronade" (hearty beef and pasta dish) or "bourride de baudroie" (monkfish stew). Afterwards, visit Théâtre Molière, the local cinemas or Théâtre de la Mer if you're here in summer. You're in for a real show with a first class eclectic cultural schedule.



Top tip :
